Abstrak

Perubahan iklim adalah isu global yang membutuhkan kolaborasi internasional. sebagai negara yang rentan terhadap dampaknya, Indonesia meratifikasi UNFCCC dan berkomitmen melalui NDC. Untuk mewujudkan komitmen ini, Indonesia mengakses pendanaan dari *Green Climate Fund* (GCF) sebagai bentuk adaptasi terhadap konvensi kerangka kerja PBB tentang *climate change* (UNFCCC). Penelitian ini menggunakan metode kualitatif dengan pendekatan studi pustaka dan teori Rezim Internasional untuk menganalisis adaptasi tersebut. Hasil penelitian ini menunjukkan bahwa Indonesia telah memperkuat kebijakan nasional, mengajukan proyek mitigasi melalui GCF, serta meningkatkan pemahaman pemangku kepentingan terhadap prosedur pendanaan GCF melalui kegiatan pelatihan dan *workshop*. upaya ini mencerminkan adaptasi Indonesia terhadap UNFCCC dalam rangka mencapai target emisi dan pembangunan berkelanjutan terkait isu perubahan iklim.

Abstract

Climate change is a global issue that requires international collaboration. As a country vulnerable to its impacts, Indonesia ratified the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and committed to climate action through its Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC). To fulfill this commitment, Indonesia has accessed funding from the Green Climate Fund (GCF) as a form of adaptation to the UNFCCC framework. This study employs a qualitative method using a literature review approach and applies International Regime Theory to analyze how Indonesia has adapted to the international climate regime. The findings show that Indonesia has strengthened national policies, submitted mitigation projects supported by GCF, and enhanced stakeholder capacity through training and workshops related to climate finance mechanisms. These efforts reflect Indonesia's adaptation to the UNFCCC in achieving its emission reduction targets and supporting sustainable development in addressing climate change.
